#### **BACKGROUND**

Hedge Invest International Funds plc (the "Company") is an open-ended investment company incorporated in Ireland on 10 June 2010 with variable capital organised under the laws of Ireland pursuant to the Companies Act 2014, the European Communities (Undertakings for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities) Regulations 2011 (as amended) (the "UCITS Regulations"), the Central Bank (Supervision and Enforcement) Act 2013 (Section 48 (1)) (Undertakings for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities) Regulations 2019 (as amended) (the "Central Bank UCITS Regulations") and with registration number 485407. Hedge Invest SGR P.A. was the promoter of the Company as at year ended 30 June 2025 and until 18 July 2025. Effective 19 July 2025, Finint Investments SGR was appointed as the promoter of the Company.

The Company is structured as an umbrella fund in that different funds (each a "Fund", collectively the "Funds") thereof may be established with the prior approval of the Central Bank of Ireland (the "Central Bank") in accordance with the Central Bank UCITS Regulations. In addition, each Fund may have more than one share class allocated to it. The shares of each class allocated to a Fund will rank pari passu with each other in all respects except as to all or any of the following:

- currency of denomination of the class;
- currency hedging;
- dividend policy;
- the level of fees and expenses to be charged; and
- the minimum subscription, minimum additional subscription, minimum holding and minimum redemption applicable.

The assets of each Fund are separate from one another and are invested in accordance with the investment objectives, policies and restrictions applicable to each such Fund. The share capital of each Fund shall at all times equal its Net Asset Value ("NAV").

There were two Funds in operation at 30 June 2025 (2024: two Funds) comprising the HI Numen Credit Fund and HI UK Select Fund.

HI CIFC Sustainable Global Bond Fund was terminated on 15 December 2023. Effective 8 May 2025, the Fund was revoked by the Central Bank.

HI BennBridge EM Absolute Return Fund were fully redeemed on 23 September 2022. The Fund continues to hold two Russian instruments under sanction that are currently being fair valued at zero. Until such assets can be traded or transferred, confirmation of final disbursement to investors cannot be issued thus the timing of the Fund's revocation is uncertain.

#### **HI Numen Credit Fund**

The Fund's investment objective is to generate absolute total rates of return generally in the credit market regardless of economic and market conditions including the level of defaults experienced in the credit market and the general direction of interest rates. the Fund seeks to achieve its investment objective primarily through investment in credit instruments listed or traded on Regulated Markets globally.

#### **Performance Review**

The HI Numen Credit Fund EUR I share class increased by 19.80% on a net basis from start of July 2024 to the end of June 2025. The EUR I class is used for representative purposes.

#### **Exposure**

The Fund was mainly exposed to bonds, credit derivatives and equities as of end of 30 June 2025.

#### Performance review

During the 12-month period from July 2024 to June 2025, the HI Numen Credit Fund registered a return of 19.80% on a net basis, driven by strategic positioning and tactical trading across diverse sectors and geographies. H2 2024 saw robust returns from government bonds amid expectations of declining inflation and interest rate cuts, contributing 4% before concerns about market expectations and geopolitical tensions prompted an exit. Argentina's government bonds were significant contributors, especially benefiting from economic restructuring prospects and favorable macro conditions.

In the early months of 2025, the Fund tactically increased exposure to Argentine bonds ahead of expected IMF announcements, while Italian corporate credits provided gains due to improved market fundamentals. Tactical hedging strategies were also effective in mitigating volatility. A new position in the AI sector, Nebius, was also significant contributor. The Fund reinvested gains from certain higher risk positions towards higher-rated credits during the first half of 2025 as geopolitical risks were reevaluated. Throughout the year, a cautious yet opportunistic stance allowed the Fund to capitalize on special situations like Telecom Italia's restructuring.

#### Market views & Outlook

We continue to remain constructive on risky assets, especially credit, as tail risks from geopolitical events recede, market is getting used to noise on Trump policy actions, and the global economy continues to do well, albeit slowing down, and we still don't see particular catalysts for a constructive stance to change. We acknowledge though that cross-assets valuations are stretched, even in the most illiquid corners of the market, and we are keeping a conservative stance in deploying risk in the book. We are bullish on duration long term as the economy is cooling down and inflation outside of the US too. While there is uncertainty about timing, an end, or pause to major global conflicts seems more probable now, and we think this could also be a potential deflationary force. We like Romania long end bonds, as the cheapest way to play all these geopolitical and deflationary themes in Europe, and like having a small position on Lebanon bonds that could benefit from a normalization in the Middle East.

We still hold Argentina bonds, but at a much reduced weight now, as economy is recovering and Kirchner's house arrest put an end to an era probably, and could boost Milei's chances to do well in midterm elections, Argentina corporate credits are very cheap compared to peers of similar credit risk in the rest of emerging markets. EU subordinated financials are still attractive to us, as banks are very well capitalized and we don't foresee much lower for longer rates in EU in the few years ahead as happened post the sovereign crisis era, therefore banks earnings power might be somewhat sustainable.

#### **Exposure**

The gross exposure of the Fund remained in the 100-140% range and the net exposure was between 0-10% during the year.

#### Performance review

This was a period of two distinct halves for the Fund, with steady and consistent performance in the first half followed by good capital protection in a much more volatile market in 2025 to 30 June 2025. A strong long-term theme for us was UK banks with both Natwest and Barclays delivering on the back of improved UK sentiment and low starting valuations. Beazley in the insurance sector also enjoyed another period of good performance as it continues to be recognised as a credible high returns business. Babcock has enjoyed the combination of self-help under the newish CEO, David Lockwood, and its defence business now being seen as a higher value operation with strong growth prospects. M&A activity has been a consistent theme across the UK market and we benefited from a bid approach from foreign exchange led challenger banking business, Alpha International, from a US peer, Corpay. The short book winners combined both expensive defensive companies such as Croda and Diageo that could not sustain that status given increasingly negative earnings momentum and more straightforward building materials sector cyclical shorts such as Travis Perkins.

The long position in Glencore was generally weak although this was somewhat hedged within the book. We bought into Oxford Instruments for a recovery that has yet to materialise. Within the short book we were a little slow to pick up the marginal change in sentiment towards BT – which drove a strong share price recovery. At First Group, management action to address some of the structural challenges has been well received by investors even if evidence of the fruits of their labour has yet to come through.

#### Market views and outlook

We were a little surprised by the strength of the market rally after the tariff wobble from early April to the end of June given the ongoing high level of geo-political tension as well that has left markets looking vulnerable into the start of the next period. In the UK, we expect to see further interest rate cut, not least as UK consumer demand appears to be slowing markedly. Earnings growth for business is hard to come by and we expect to see more companies warning on their forecasts as the year progresses.

The UK government has become weaker politically and their funding challenges have also increased as cost saving social care reforms have been rejected. This will create more focus on the chancellor's autumn statement where some form of tax rises seem ever more likely. This uncertain environment should play to the strategy's strength overall, but we remain mindful of the risk of sentiment swings and crowding in some parts of the market and we will seek to navigate this carefully while maintaining the Fund's factor neutrality.

#### **DIRECTORS' REPORT**

The Directors present their report together with the audited financial statements of the Company for the year ended 30 June 2025.

#### Review of principal activities and future developments

The Company was approved by the Central Bank on 30 May 2010, incorporated on 10 June 2010 and commenced operations on 10 June 2011. The results of operations for the year ended 30 June 2025 are set out in the Statement of Comprehensive Income on page 18.

The HI Numen Credit Fund launched on 10 June 2011. The Fund is registered in Germany, Italy, Luxembourg, Spain, Switzerland and the United Kingdom.

The HI UK Select Fund launched on 31 October 2012. The Fund is registered in France, Germany, Italy, Luxembourg, Spain, Switzerland and the United Kingdom.

The HI BennBridge EM Absolute Return Fund launched on 6 March 2015 and was fully redeemed on 23 September 2022.

Effective 8 May 2025, HI CIFC Sustainable Global Bond Fund was revoked by the Central Bank.

The business and future developments are reviewed in detail in the Investment Manager's Report on page 4.

#### **Distribution**

The Funds may issue redeemable class of shares which are either Accumulating classes or Distributing classes. The income and gains attributable to the Accumulating classes in the Fund will not be distributed and will be reflected in the net asset value per share. Where any Distributing classes are issued, the Directors may declare distributions semi-annually each year to the shareholders of such classes out of the net income of the Fund attributable to the Distributing classes, in accordance with the terms of the Prospectus. The distribution details are disclosed in note 19.

## **Accounting Records**

The measures taken by the Directors to secure compliance with the Company's obligation to keep adequate accounting records are the use of appropriate systems and procedures. In this regard, J.P. Morgan Administration Services (Ireland) Limited have been appointed for the purpose of maintaining adequate accounting records. Accordingly, the accounting records are kept at 200 Capital Dock, 79 Sir John Rogerson's Quay, Dublin 2, D02 RK57, Ireland.

#### **Independent Auditor**

Deloitte Ireland LLP were appointed as the Company's Independent Auditor and expressed their willingness to continue in office in accordance with Section 383(2) of the Companies Act, 2014.

#### **Corporate Governance**

The Board of Directors has assessed the measures included in the voluntary Corporate Governance Code for Investment Funds and Management Companies as published by Irish Funds in December 2011 (the "IF Code"). The Board has adopted all corporate governance practices and procedures in the IF Code and continued to comply with the requirements of the IF Code for the year ended 30 June 2025.

#### **Audit Committee**

The Company has elected not to put an audit committee in place for the Company for the following reasons:

- (a) the nature, scale and complexity of the Company;
- (b) the internal control and risk management systems relating to the financial reporting process already in place at the Company; and
- (c) the resources available to the Company and the resources and expertise of the various third parties engaged to support the Company.

#### Significant events during the year

Effective 8 May 2025, HI CIFC Sustainable Global Bond Fund was revoked by the Central Bank.

There were no other significant events during the year.

#### Subsequent events

According to the agreement for the transfer of a business unit entered between Hedge Invest SGR and Finint Investments SGR S.p.A, company of the Banca Finint Group, on 19 December 2024, with effective date 19 July 2025 Finint Investments SGR S.p.A has been appointed as the Promoter and Investment Manager of the Company. There were not material impacts on the day-to-day operations of the Company or on the personnel currently responsible for managing the Company.

Effective 21 July 2025, the updated Prospectus and Supplements were noted by the Central Bank to reflect the changes to the Promoter and Investment Manager.

There were no other significant events subsequent to the year end.

#### Risk management

The Company's exposure to risk is disclosed in more detail in the financial statements and associated risk notes on pages 25 to 31.

#### **Employees**

The Company had no employees during the year ended 30 June 2025 (30 June 2024: Nil). J.P. Morgan Administration Services (Ireland) Limited acts as a corporate administrator to the Company in accordance with the terms of the service agreement.

## Transactions with connected parties

Regulation 43(1) of the Central Bank UCITS Regulations states that a responsible person shall ensure that any transactions carried out with a UCITS by a promoter, manager, depositary, investment adviser and/or associated or group companies of these ("connected persons") must be carried out as if negotiated at arm's length and must be in the best interests of the shareholders.

As required under the Central Bank UCITS Regulations 81(4), the Board of Directors of the Manager (responsible person) are satisfied that there are in place arrangements, evidenced by written procedures, to ensure that the obligations prescribed by Regulation 43(1) are applied to all transactions with connected persons; and all transactions with connected persons entered into during the year complied with the obligations prescribed by Regulation 43(1).

#### Report on the audit of the financial statements

Opinion on the financial statements of Hedge Invest International Funds Plc ("the company")

In our opinion the financial statements:

- give a true and fair view of the assets, liabilities and financial position of the company as at 30 June 2025 and of the profit for the financial year then ended; and
- have been properly prepared in accordance with the relevant financial reporting framework, the applicable Regulations and, in particular, with the requirements of the Companies Act 2014.

The financial statements we have audited comprise:

- the Statement of Financial Position;
- the Statement of Comprehensive Income;
- the Statement of Changes in Net Assets attributable to Shareholders;
- the Statement of Cash Flows; and
- the related notes 1 to 22, including material accounting policy information as set out in note 2.

The relevant financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is the Companies Act 2014 and IFRS Accounting Standards as issued by the International Accounting Standards Board (IASB) and as adopted by the European Union ("the relevant financial reporting framework").

The applicable regulations that have been applied in their preparation is the European Communities (Undertakings for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities) Regulations, 2011 and Central Bank (Supervision and Enforcement) Act 2013 (Section 48(1)) (Undertakings for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities) Regulations, 2019 ("the applicable Regulations").

#### Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (Ireland) (ISAs (Ireland)) and applicable law. Our responsibilities under those standards are described below in the "Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements" section of our report.

We are independent of the company in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in Ireland, including the Ethical Standard issued by the Irish Auditing and Accounting Supervisory Authority, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

#### Conclusions relating to going concern

In auditing the financial statements, we have concluded that the directors' use of the going concern basis of accounting in the preparation of the financial statements is appropriate.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### For the year ended 30 June 2025

#### 1. Basis of preparation

#### a) Statement of compliance

The financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2025 have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS") as adopted by the European Union ("EU"). Companies Act 2014, European Communities (Undertakings for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities) Regulations 2011 (as amended) (the "UCITS Regulations"), the Central Bank (Supervision and Enforcement) Act 2013 (Section 48 (1)) (Undertakings for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities) Regulations 2019 (as amended) (the "Central Bank UCITS Regulations"). The financial statements of the Company have been prepared on a going concern basis.

#### b) Basis of measurement

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis except for financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss and derivative financial instruments which are measured at fair value.

#### c) Functional and presentation currency

The financial statements are presented in the currency of the primary economic environment in which the Funds operate (the "functional currency"). The financial statements are presented in Euro ("EUR"), which is the functional currency of the Company and its Funds reflecting the fact that the denomination of the redeemable shares of the Company and majority of the subscriptions and redemptions of the redeemable shares are denominated in EUR, except CHF D Shares, CHF DM Shares, CHF DM2 Shares, CHF R Shares, GBP DM2 Dist Shares, USD D Shares, USD DM2 Shares, USD I2 Shares and USD R Shares which are denominated in Swiss Franc, British Pound and US Dollar respectively. The presentation currency of HI Numen Credit Fund, HI UK Select Fund and HI BennBridge EM Absolute Return Fund is Euro.

## d) Use of estimates and judgements

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with IFRS as adopted by the EU requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expense. Information about judgements made in applying accounting policies that have the most significant effects on the amounts recognised in the financial statements is included in note 2(e). Refer to note 15 for details in relation to the determination of fair value of financial instruments with significant unobservable inputs.

### 2. Material accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been consistently applied in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the Company's financial statements.

#### a) Interest income and expense recognition

Interest income and expense are recognised in the Statement of Comprehensive Income using the effective interest method.

#### b) Expenses

Expenses are accounted for on an accruals basis and are charged to the Statement of Comprehensive Income.

#### c) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand. Bank overdrafts are disclosed separately in the Statement of Financial Position under current liabilities, if any.

#### d) Transaction costs

Transaction costs are incremental costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition, issue or disposal of a financial asset or financial liability. An incremental cost is one that would not have been incurred if the entity had not acquired, issued or disposed of the financial instrument. When a financial asset or financial liability at fair value through profit or loss is recognised initially, it is measured at its fair value through profit or loss excluding transaction cost. Transaction costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition or issue of the financial asset or financial liability are expensed immediately in the Statement of Comprehensive Income.

- e) Investments

#### Classification

The Company classifies all of its investment portfolio as financial assets or liabilities at fair value through profit or loss.

#### Financial assets at fair value through profit or loss

The Company classifies its investments based on both the Company's business model for managing those financial assets and the contractual cash flow characteristics of the financial assets. The portfolio of financial assets is managed and performance is evaluated on a fair value basis. The Company is primarily focused on fair value information and uses that information to assess the assets' performance and to make decisions. The contractual cash flows of the Company's debt securities are solely principal and interest, however, these securities are neither held for the purpose of collecting contractual cash flows nor held both for collecting contractual cash flows and for sale. The collection of contractual cash flows is only incidental to achieving the Company's business model's objective. Consequently, all investments are measured at fair value through profit or loss. Derivative contracts that have a positive fair value are presented as financial assets at fair value through profit or loss.

#### Financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss

Derivative contracts that have a negative fair value are presented as liabilities at fair value through profit or loss.

### Recognition/derecognition

Purchases and sales of investments are accounted for on the day the trade transaction takes place. Financial assets are derecognised when the rights to receive cash flows from the investments have expired or the risks and rewards of ownership have all been substantially transferred. Financial liabilities are derecognised when the obligation specified in the contract is discharged, cancelled or expires. Realised gains and losses on disposals are calculated using the average cost method and are reflected as net gains/(losses) on financial assets/liabilities at fair value through profit or loss in the Statement of Comprehensive Income.

#### Measurement

Financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss are initially recognised at fair value. Gains and losses arising from changes in the fair value of the financial assets or financial liabilities are presented in the Statement of Comprehensive Income in the year in which they arise. Transaction costs are expensed in the Statement of Comprehensive Income as incurred and included in net gains/(losses) on financial assets at fair value through profit or loss.

#### Fair value estimation

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The fair value of financial assets and liabilities traded in active markets (such as publicly traded derivatives and trading securities) are based on quoted market price at the close of trading on the reporting date. The Company has applied IFRS 13 to utilise the last traded market price for both financial assets and financial liabilities when the last traded price falls within the bid-ask spread.

In circumstances where the last traded price is not within the bid-ask spread, management will decide the point within the bid-ask spread that is most representative of fair value.

#### Forward currency contracts

A forward currency contract is an agreement between two parties to buy or sell a foreign currency at a future date, at a negotiated rate, the purpose of which is to manage currency risk arising from the Funds' investment activities. The unrealised gain or loss on open forward currency contracts is calculated discounting the contractual cashflows using a market rate. Unrealised gains and losses are included in the Statement of Financial Position. Realised gains or losses are recognised on the maturity of a contract as the difference between the rate that the contract was entered into and the closing spot rate at the settlement date of the contract. Realised gains or losses and changes in unrealised gains or losses are recognised in the Statement of Comprehensive Income.

#### e) Investments (continued)

#### **Futures contracts**

A futures contract is a contract, traded on a futures exchange, to buy or sell a certain underlying instrument at a certain date in the future, at a specified price. The changes in value of open futures contracts are recognised as unrealised gains or losses by marking-to-market the value of the contract at the year end date. Changes in the futures contracts' value are settled daily with the exchange by paying or receiving a variation margin amount. When the contract is closed, the difference between the proceeds from (or cost of) the closing transactions and the original transaction is recorded in the net gains/(losses) on financial assets/(liabilities) at fair value through profit or loss in the Statement of Comprehensive Income.

#### Credit default swaps

A credit default swap is a financial contract whereby one party (the protection buyer) pays a fee in return for a payment by the protection seller contingent on the occurrence of a credit event with respect to a referenced entity.

The upfront payment received by the Fund, as protection seller, is recorded as a liability on the Fund's Statement of Financial Position. An upfront payment made by the Fund, as protection buyer, is recorded as an asset in the Fund's Statement of Financial Position.

Contracts are fair valued daily and the change, if any, is recorded as a net gain/(loss) on financial assets/(liabilities) at fair value through profit or loss.

#### **Contracts for difference**

A contract for difference ("CFD") is an agreement between the Fund and a CFD counterparty to pay or receive the change in the value of an underlying security.

At each valuation point, the difference in price between the opening price of the CFD and the market price of the underlying equity is recorded as the fair value (unrealised gain or loss) of the CFD in the Statement of Financial Position.

When the CFD is closed, the difference between the opening price of the CFD and the closing price is recorded within net gains/(losses) on financial assets/liabilities at fair value through profit or loss.

#### f) Offsetting

Financial assets and liabilities are offset and the net amount reported in the Statement of Financial Position when there is a legally enforceable right to set-off the recognized amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis, or realise the assets and settle the liability simultaneously. Refer credit risk at note 3 for further details.

## g) Redeemable Shares

Redeemable shares are redeemable in accordance with the provisions of the Company's Prospectus at the shareholder's option and are classified as financial liabilities. The redeemable shares can be put back to the Company at any time for cash equal to a proportionate share of the applicable Fund's Net Asset Value. The redeemable share is carried at the redemption amount that is payable at Statement of Financial Position date if the shareholder exercised its right to put the share back to the Fund.

#### h) New standards and amendments to existing standards

#### (i) Standards, amendments and interpretations issued and effective

There are no standards, amendments to standards or interpretations that are effective for annual periods beginning 1 July 2024 that have a material effect on the financial statements.

(ii) New standards, amendments and interpretations issued but not yet effective and not early adopted

A number of new standards, amendments to standards and interpretations are effective for annual periods beginning after 1 July 2024, and have not been early adopted in preparing these financial statements. None of these are expected to have a material effect on the financial statements of the Company.

#### 3. Financial Instruments and associated risks

The Board of Directors has overall responsibility for the establishment and oversight of the Company's risk management framework.

The Company's activities expose it to a variety of financial risks, such as: a. market risk (i) price risk, (ii) currency risk, (iii) interest rate risk, b. liquidity risk and c. credit risk. The Company's overall risk management programme focuses on the unpredictability of financial markets and seeks to minimise potential adverse effects of the Company's financial performance. The Company may use derivative financial instruments to moderate certain risk exposures.

#### a) Market risk

#### (i) Price risk

Price risk arises mainly from uncertainty about the future prices of financial instruments held, it represents the potential loss the Company may suffer through holding market positions in the face of price movements. Where allowable under the investment objective and policy of the Company, the Investment Manager mitigates the risk of excessive exposure to any particular type of security or issuer.

The Funds are exposed to price risk arising from their investments as listed in the Schedule of Investments.

For HI Numen Credit Fund and HI UK Select Fund, the Investment Manager uses a risk management technique known as absolute value-at-risk ("VaR") to assess the Fund's market risk to seek to ensure that the use of Financial Derivative Instruments ("FDI") by the Funds is within the regulatory limits.

The VaR on the portfolio of HI Numen Credit Fund shall not exceed 4.47% in any one day. The VaR on the portfolio of HI UK Select Fund shall not exceed 20% in 20 days holding period or 4.46% in any one day.

The Investment Manager uses a Monte Carlo model for HI Numen Credit Fund and HI UK Select Fund generated by Risk Metrics Portfolio Value-at-Risk system. The confidence level of HI Numen Credit Fund and HI UK Select Fund shall be 99% and the holding period shall be one trading day. The historical observation period will not be less than one year, however, a shorter observation period may be used when appropriate.

#### (ii) Currency risk

Foreign currency risk is the risk that the value of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in foreign exchange rates. The Company may invest in securities denominated in currencies other than its reporting currency. Consequently, the Company is exposed to risks that the exchange rate of its reporting currency relative to other currencies may change in a manner which has an adverse effect on the value of the portion of the Company's assets which are denominated in currencies other than its own currency.

The Company invested in forward currency contracts to manage foreign currency risk. The Funds may enter into forward currency contracts in order to hedge against foreign currency exchange rate risk of non-EUR denominated classes in HI Numen Credit Fund and HI UK Select Fund. The realised or unrealised gains/losses are allocated to the hedged share classes.

## b) Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that the Company will encounter in realising assets or otherwise raising funds to meet financial commitments.

Where Shareholders redeem their shareholding in the Funds of the Company for an amount which exceeds the amount of cash or other liquid assets immediately available to fund such redemptions, the Funds may, subject to the provision of the Prospectus of the Company, decide to restrict redemption or, seek to liquidate additional assets to fund the redemption.

This may limit or otherwise affect the ability of each Fund to operate or manage investment positions and strategies within its portfolio and restrict or materially affect investment performance and returns. The Funds held debt securities, equities, warrants, contract for difference (CFDs), credit default swaps, forward currency contracts and futures contracts as at 30 June 2025.

The majority of the Funds' financial liabilities including net assets attributable to redeemable participating shareholders fall due within one month.

#### c) Credit risk

Credit risk is the risk that an issuer of securities will be unable to pay principal and interest when due or that the value of the security will suffer because investors believe the issuer is less able to pay. The Investment Manager manages credit risk by pursuing a policy of diversification amongst issuers and counterparties and by monitoring the creditworthiness of individual issuers and counterparties in accordance with the investment objective, policies and restrictions applicable to the Funds. The Funds' investments in bonds expose them to the default risk of the bond issuer with regards to interest or principal payments. The Funds' investments in credit default swaps as a seller of protection exposes them to the default risk of the underlying counterparty with regards to interest or principal payments.

Credit ratings of debt securities or credit or reference entities represent the rating agencies' opinions regarding their credit quality and are not a guarantee of future credit performance of such securities. Rating agencies attempt to evaluate the safety of principal and interest payments and do not evaluate the risks of fluctuations in market value.

Cash and cash equivalents, were held with J.P. Morgan SE - Dublin Branch (the "Depositary") at year end. The Depositary does not have a credit rating, however, its parent company J.P. Morgan SE has a long-term credit rating of AA- at the year ended 30 June 2025 (30 June 2024: A+).

Transactions involving derivative financial instruments are usually with counterparties with whom the Company has signed International Swaps and Derivatives Association ("ISDA") agreements. ISDA agreements provide for the net settlement of contracts with the same counterparty in the event of default. The counterparty credit risk associated with derivative financial assets subject to ISDA agreements is eliminated only to the extent that financial liabilities due to the same counterparty will be settled after the assets are realised. The exposure to counterparty credit risk reduced by ISDA agreements may change significantly within a short period of time as a result of transactions subject to the arrangement. The corresponding assets and liabilities have not been offset on the Statement of Financial Position.

There is no performance fee charged to EUR FOF Shares, EUR M Shares, and GBP M Shares.

As the performance fee depends on the performance of the Net Asset Value per share of the class in question, it is not possible to predict the amount of performance fee that will be payable and there is in effect, no maximum performance fee as it is impossible to quantify any outperformance in advance.

#### **HI UK Select Fund**

A performance fees in respect of all share classes of the Fund (except EUR FOF Shares) is equal to 20% (save for the EUR Super-I Shares and GBP Super-I Shares) or equal to 15% (for EUR Super-I Shares and GBP Super-I Shares) of the increase in the Net Asset Value per Share of the relevant applicable share class outstanding in respect of each performance period subject to a high water mark shall be payable.

Performance period refers to each fiscal year ending 30 June. The performance fee shall be calculated and accrued on each dealing day.

#### c) Administrator's fees

The Company shall pay the Administrator out of the assets of each Fund an annual fee calculated and accrued daily and payable monthly in arrears at a rate of up to a maximum of 0.10% per annum of the Net Asset Value of the Fund.

The Administrator shall also be entitled to be repaid out of the assets of each Fund agreed fees and transaction charges, at normal commercial rates together with any reasonable out of pocket expenses incurred on behalf of each Fund.

The Administrator's fees incurred by the Company for the year ended 30 June 2025 and 30 June 2024 are disclosed in operating expenses in the Statement of Comprehensive Income. The Administrator's fees outstanding at the year ended 30 June 2025 and 30 June 2024 are disclosed in note 10 of the financial statements.

#### d) Depositary's fees

The Company shall pay the Depositary out of the assets of the Fund an annual depositary fee, calculated and accrued daily and payable monthly in arrears at a rate of up to a maximum of 0.03% per annum of the Net Asset Value of each Fund (subject to a minimum annual depositary fee of EUR 40,000 at the Company level and a minimum annual depositary fee of EUR 24,000 per Fund).

The Depositary shall also be repaid custody charges, transaction charges, sub-custodial fees and reasonable out of pocket expenses as agreed, at normal commercial rates, incurred on behalf of the Funds.

The Depositary's fees incurred by the Company for the year ended 30 June 2025 and 30 June 2024 are included in operating expenses in the Statement of Comprehensive Income. The Depositary's fees outstanding at the year ended 30 June 2025 and 30 June 2024 are disclosed in Statement of Financial Position (disclosed in note 10).

#### e) Directors' fees

The Directors shall be entitled to a fee and remuneration for their services at a rate to be determined from time to time by the Directors provided that the total amount paid to the Directors in any one financial year may not exceed EUR 175,000, without the approval of the Board. Antonello Balzaretti and Alessandra Curnis, non-executive Directors, do not receive any remuneration. All Directors will be entitled to reimbursement by the Company of expenses properly incurred in connection with the business of the Company or the discharge of their duties. The Directors' fees incurred by the Company amounted to EUR 65,000 for the year ended 30 June 2025 (30 June 2024: EUR 65,000).

#### f) Audit fees

The audit fees incurred by the Company amounted to EUR 42,000 for the year ended 30 June 2025 (30 June 2024: EUR 40,000). Fees relate solely to the audit of the Company.

There were no other assurance services or other non-audit services provided by Deloitte Ireland LLP as the auditor of the Company (30 June 2024: Same).

#### g) Manager's fees

The Manager shall be paid a fee out of the assets of the Fund, calculated and accrued on each Dealing Day and payable monthly in arrears, of an amount up to 0.04% of the Net Asset Value of the Fund (plus VAT, if any), subject to a minimum monthly fee up to EUR 4,000 per month (plus VAT, if any) to be prorated across the Funds of the Company proportionate to each Fund's assets under management. The Manager is also entitled to receive out of the assets of the Fund reasonable and properly vouched out of pocket expenses, which will be at normal commercial rates.

The Manager's fees incurred by the Company amounted to EUR 48,000 for the year ended 30 June 2025 (30 June 2024: 52,668), of which EUR Nil was payable for the year ended 30 June 2025 (30 June 2024: EUR Nil).

#### 6. Transaction costs

Disclosed in the table below are separately identifiable transaction costs incurred by the relevant Funds for the year ended 30 June 2025 and 30 June 2024. These include brokerage commissions and broker fees on exchange traded futures contracts, options and equities. Transaction costs on bonds, credit default swaps, CFD, and forward currency contracts could not be separately identified. Transaction costs on these are included in the purchase and sales price of the investment and cannot be separately verified or disclosed. Transaction costs on equities are embedded in the cost of the investment and included in net gains/(losses) on financial assets at fair value through profit or loss within the Statement of Comprehensive Income of each Fund.

#### 11. Taxation

The Company is an investment undertaking as defined in Section 739B of the Taxes Consolidation Act, 1997. Therefore, the Company is not liable to tax in respect of its income and gains other than on the occurrence of a chargeable event.

Generally a chargeable event arises on any distribution, redemption, repurchase, cancellation, transfer of shares or the ending of a "Relevant Period". A "Relevant Period" is an eight year period beginning with the acquisition of the shares by the shareholder and each subsequent period of eight years beginning immediately after the preceding Relevant Period.

A chargeable event does not arise in respect of:

- a) a shareholder who is not Irish resident and not ordinarily resident in Ireland at the time of the chargeable event, provided the necessary signed statutory declarations are held by the Company:
- b) certain exempted Irish tax resident investors who have provided the Company with the necessary signed statutory declarations:
- c) an exchange of shares arising on qualifying amalgamation or reconstruction of the Company with another fund;
- d) any transaction in relation to shares held in a recognised clearing system as designated by order of the Revenue Commissioners of Ireland;
- e) certain exchanges of shares between spouses and former spouses on the occasion of judicial separation and/or divorce; or
- f) an exchange by a shareholder, effected by way of an arm's length bargain where no payment is made to the shareholder of shares in the Company for other shares in the Company.

Capital gains, dividends and interest (if any) received on investments made by the Company may be subject to withholding taxes imposed by the country from which the investment income/gains are received and such taxes may not be recoverable by the Company or its shareholders.

In the absence of an appropriate signed declaration, the Company will be liable to Irish tax on the occurrence of a chargeable event, and the Company reserves its right to withhold such taxes from the relevant shareholders.

Withholding tax on dividends and interest received was recorded on an accrual basis and are included in taxation on the accompanying Statement of Comprehensive Income.

#### 12. Share capital

The issued and fully paid redeemable participating share capital is at all times equal to the NAV of the Company. Redeemable participating shares are redeemable at the shareholders' option and are classified as financial liabilities.

The authorised share capital of the Company is two Subscriber Shares of €1 each and 50,000,000,000,000 Shares of no par value.

The Investment Manager and AM Holdings S.p.A, the parent company of the Investment Manager, each hold one subscriber share.

John Skelly, a Director of the Company, is a Principal of Carne Global Financial Services Limited, the parent Company of the Manager. The fees earned by John Skelly from the Company amounted to EUR 30,000 for the year ended 30 June 2025 (30 June 2024: EUR 30,000). The fees paid to Carne Global Financial Services Limited in respect of other fund governance services provided to the Company, amounted to EUR 95,970 for the year ended 30 June 2025 (30 June 2024: EUR 92,902) of which EUR Nil was outstanding at 30 June 2025 (30 June 2024: EUR Nil).

Antonello Balzaretti, Non-Executive Director of the Company, was an employee of Hedge Invest SGR P.A., the Promoter and Investment Manager as of 30 June 2025 and until 18 July 2025. Antonello Balzaretti is an employee of Finint Investments SGR S.p.A., the Promoter and Investment Manager from 19 July 2025. Effective 31 May 2025, Alessandra Curnis resigned as a Non-Executive Director of the Company and was previously employed by Hedge Invest SGR P.A.. They don't receive any remuneration.

Funds and accounts managed by the Investment Manager owned 11.7% of the Company as at 30 June 2025 (30 June 2024: 12%). The Managers, Directors and employees of the Investment Manager and Sub-Investment Managers owned 0.7% of the Company as at 30 June 2025 (30 June 2024: 0.6%). Fees paid to the Investment Manager during the year and the balances outstanding at the year end are disclosed in notes 8 and 10 respectively.

#### **Transactions with connected parties**

Regulation 43(1) of the Central Bank UCITS Regulations states that a responsible person shall ensure that any transactions carried out with a UCITS by a promoter, manager, depositary, investment adviser and/or associated or group companies of these ("connected persons") must be carried out as if negotiated at arm's length and must be in the best interests of the shareholders.

As required under the Central Bank UCITS Regulations 81(4), the Board of Directors of the Manager (responsible person) are satisfied that there are in place arrangements, evidenced by written procedures, to ensure that the obligations prescribed by Regulation 43(1) are applied to all transactions with connected persons; and all transactions with connected persons entered into during the year complied with the obligations prescribed by Regulation 43(1).

#### 15. Fair value measurement

Level 1 - Quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.

Level 2 - Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly (that is, as prices) or indirectly (that is, derived from prices).

Level 3 - Inputs for the asset or liability that are not based on observable market data (that is, unobservable inputs).

The level in the fair value hierarchy, within which the fair value measurement is categorised in its entirety, is determined on the basis of the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement in its entirety. For this purpose, the significance of an input is assessed against the fair value measurement in its entirety.

The determination of what constitutes 'observable' requires significant judgement by the Company. The Company considers observable data to be that market data that is readily available, regularly distributed or updated, reliable and verifiable, not proprietary, and provided by independent sources that are actively involved in the relevant market.

The Company may employ investment techniques and instruments for efficient portfolio management of the assets of the Company or of any Fund and for short-term investment purposes under the conditions and limits set out by the Central Bank under the UCITS Regulations, and in the Prospectus.

The Investment Manager of the Company has identified that forward currency contracts may be used for both hedging and efficient portfolio management purposes for HI UK Select Fund. For HI Numen Credit Fund, forward currency contracts may be used for investment, hedging or efficient portfolio management purposes. Those foreign exchange contracts entered into for hedging purposes are utilised to reduce foreign exchange risk and all other financial derivative instruments ("FDI") are used for investment purposes.

Transaction costs on the purchase and sale of forward currency contracts are included in the purchase and sale price of the investment. These costs cannot be practically or reliably gathered as they are embedded in the cost of the investment and cannot be separately verified or disclosed. Details of all open forward currency contracts at the year end are disclosed in the Schedule of Investments.

The Company did not enter into any repurchase agreements, reverse repurchase agreements or stock lending during the year.

#### **UCITS V Remuneration Disclosure**

The European Union Directive 2014/91/EU as implemented in Ireland by S.I. No. 143/2016 - European Union (Undertakings for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities) (as amended) Regulations 2016, requires management companies to establish and apply remuneration policies and practices that promote sound and effective risk management, and do not encourage risk taking which is inconsistent with the risk profile of the UCITS.

To that effect, Carne Global Fund Managers (Ireland) Limited ("the Manager"), has implemented a remuneration policy that applies to all UCITS for which the Manager acts as manager (the "Remuneration Policy") and covers all staff whose professional activities have a material impact on the risk profile of the Manager or the UCITS it manages ("Identified Staff of the Manager"). The Remuneration Policy also applies to all alternative investment funds for which the Manager acts as alternative investment fund manager. In accordance with the Remuneration Policy, all remuneration paid to Identified Staff of the Manager can be divided into:

- Fixed remuneration (payments or benefits without consideration of any performance criteria); and
- Variable remuneration (additional payments or benefits depending on performance or, in certain cases, other contractual criteria) which is not based on the performance of the UCITS.

The Manager has designated the following persons as Identified Staff of the Manager:

- 1. The Designated Persons;
- 2. Each of the Manager's directors;
- 3. Head of Compliance;
- 4. Risk Officer:
- 5. Head of Anti-Money Laundering and Counter Terrorist Financing Compliance;
- 6. Money Laundering Reporting Officer;
- 7. Chief Executive Officer;
- 8. Chief Operating Officer;
- 9. Chief Information Officer;
- 10. All members of the investment committee:
- 11. All members of the risk committee;
- 12. All members of the valuation committee.

The Manager has a business model, policies, and procedures which by their nature do not promote excessive risk taking and take account of the nature, scale, and complexity of the Manager and the UCITS. The Remuneration Policy is designed to discourage risk taking that is inconsistent with the risk profile of the UCITS and the Manager is not incentivised or rewarded for taking excessive risk.

The Manager has determined not to constitute a separate remuneration committee and for remuneration matters to be determined through the Manager's Compliance and AML Committee, a Committee of the Manager's Board.

The Manager's Compliance and AML Committee is responsible for the ongoing implementation of the Manager's remuneration matters and will assess, oversee, and review the remuneration arrangements of the Manager as well as that of the delegates as relevant, in line with the provisions of the applicable remuneration requirements.

The Manager has a number of directly employed staff. The Manager's parent company is Carne Global Financial Services Limited ("Carne"). In addition, Carne also operates through a shared services organisational model which provides that Carne employs staff and further enters into inter-group agreements with other Carne Group entities within the group to ensure such entities are resourced appropriately. As at 31 December 2024, 10 of the Identified Staff are employed directly by the Manager. The remainder of the Identified Staff are employees of Carne, or employees of another entity within the Carne Group, and are remunerated directly based on their contribution to Carne Group as a whole. In return for the services of each of the Carne Identified Staff, the Manager pays an annual staff recharge to Carne (the "Staff Recharge").

The independent non-executive directors are paid a fixed remuneration. The Other Identified Staff member's remuneration is linked to their overall individual contribution to the Manager or the Carne Group, with reference to both financial and non-financial criteria and not directly linked to the performance of specific business units or targets reached or the performance of the UCITS.

The aggregate of the total Staff Recharge, remuneration of the directly employed identified staff of the Manager and the remuneration of the independent non-executive directors for the year ended 31 December 2024 is EUR 2,553,588 paid to 22 Identified Staff\* for the year ended 31 December 2024.

The Manager has also determined that, on the basis of number of funds / net asset value of the UCITS relative to the number of funds / assets under management, the portion of this figure attributable to the UCITS is EUR 6,624.
